## PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the Supreme Court of the State of New York, East Judicial District.

The petition of Abraham Rosenthal hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is Mechanic 17 Sutton St New York, N. Y.

Second. My occupation is Mechanic

Third. I was born on the 17 day of May anno Domini 1883 in Poland

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Poland on or about the 15 day of May anno Domini 1905

anno Domini 1905 and arrived in the United States at the port of New York on the 15 day of May

anno Domini 1905 on the vessel Patuxent

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 17 day of May anno Domini 1905

at New York in the Supreme Court of New York

Sixth. I am Married my wife's name is Miriam she was born at New York anno Domini 1887

and now resides at with me New York, N. Y.

I have 6 children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to the Republic of Poland and Russia of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of two years at least, immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 15 day of May anno Domini 1903 and in the State of New York, continuously and preceding the date of this petition, since the 15 day of May anno Domini 1905 being a resident within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship in any court. (I made petition for citizenship in the Supreme Court of New York at New York on the 17 day of May anno Domini 1905 and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes to wit, and the names of said Court and said reasons and causes are annexed)

attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
