

DETAILS

Investigation was instituted in this matter upon receipt of Form ENF-201 from the Central Office, indicating that the SUBJECT had stated on her alien registration form that she was a member of the International Workers Order. Form G-135 was executed and the returns were negative. Clearances were obtained from the local office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, New Haven, Connecticut, and that office indicated that their records disclosed that "one N. ROSENTHAL was among the signers of the "Morning Freiheit" Anniversary Issue, dated 11-7-46, published on the 29th Anniversary of the Soviet Union".

Investigation had originally been conducted at Miami, Florida, where the SUBJECT had lived for a few years. No derogatory information pertaining to the SUBJECT was obtained in the Florida area.

SUBJECT now resides at Guilford, Connecticut, with her husband and is self-employed with her husband in the poultry business.

On June 3, 1955, SUBJECT was interviewed at home in Guilford and testified that she has made but one entry into the United States, which was in 1917, when she was admitted for permanent residence; that she married her husband, Albert ROSENTHAL, about thirty years ago; that they had three children as a result of this marriage; and that two of her sons served in the United States Army, her son Irving having been a captain in the United States Army Medical Corps and her son Samuel, a sergeant in the United States Army Infantry. SUBJECT stated she had never been arrested in this or any other country. She claimed that she belonged to no organizations, but that for a number of years her husband had enrolled her name in the International Workers Order for its insurance benefits and that she had ceased her membership in the International Workers Order in approximately 1951. She testified that she is not now, nor has she ever been, a member of the Communist Party. A check of the police records at Guilford and New Haven, Connecticut failed to reveal any record pertaining to our SUBJECT.

Several of our confidential informants, who are somewhat familiar with the activities of the Communist Party in Guilford and New Haven, Connecticut were contacted and stated that this SUBJECT was totally unknown to them.

In view of the investigation as conducted above, there appears to be no violation of the Immigration and Nationality Act. It is respectfully recommended that our file in this matter be considered closed.

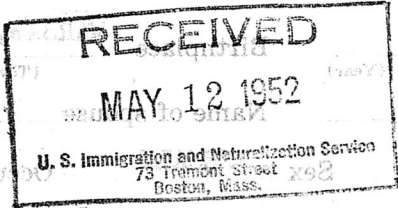





The owner of the rooming house, Mr. Frank Pearl stated that he could not remember anyone of the subject's name. However, his records indicate that a person of the subject's name resided in one of the apartments for possibly one week during the winter season of 1940.

The Miami Beach address of 1039 Washington Avenue listed in the subject's file as being her address November 4, 1941, is and has been for several years a sundry shop, the proprietor of which stated that he had never heard of the subject.
