## PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the Supreme Court of the State of New York, First Judicial District:

The petition of

Third. I was born on the 13 day of May, 1874, at Liverpool, England.

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Liverpool, England, on board the SS May Queen, on the 15 day of May, 1892, and arrived in the United States, at the port of Philadelphia, Pa., on the 23 day of May, 1892.

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 5 day of January, 1901, and am Donald J. Goss.

Sixth. I am married. My wife's name is Anna Goss, and she was born on the 12 day of August, 1878, and is Donald J. Goss.

Seventh. I have no children, and she resides at 246 E. Houston St., New York, N.Y.

Sixth. I am not a subscriber to or opponent to organized communism or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to the present government of Mexico.

Seventh. I am able to speak the English language.

Eighth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least, immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 73 day of May, 1901, and to the State of New York continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 23 day of May, 1901, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Ninth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I make this declaration under oath, and the date of this declaration is the same as the date of this petition, and the date of this declaration is the same as the date of this petition.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two testifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Therefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
